On a motion by Councilor Moreside and a second by Councilor Rogers, it was unanimously voted to award these bids to the High Bidders. Also part of the motion included that the property located at 28 Lincoln Street needs to be brought back to live-in condition within 1 year.

Following a brief presentation of the "Shine the Light" program from representatives of The Next Step, it was moved by Councilor Rogers, seconded by Councilor Moreside, and unanimously voted to authorize The Next Step to erect a Lighted Tree in the Gazebo at Memorial Park during the Month of May, 2017.

It was moved by Councilor Mingo and seconded by Councilor Rogers to approve the Sewer Commitment for the Quarter Ending March 31, 2016 in the amount of \$226,595.40. Voting in favor were Councilors Rogers, Mingo, Moreside and Mayor Moore. Councilor Howard was opposed. Motion carried.

On a motion by Councilor Howard and a second by Councilor Rogers, it was unanimously voted to grant an abatement of sewer charges in the amount of \$197.22 on Account #1666.

On a motion by Councilor Moreside and a second by Councilor Howard, it was unanimously voted to schedule a Public Hearing on April 29, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. to discuss acceptance of a \$700,000 Public Infrastructure CDBG Grant.

It was moved by Councilor Mingo and seconded by Councilor Rogers to write-off and send to collections Ambulance Debt totaling of \$8,052.87. Voting in Favor of this motion were Councilors Rogers, Mingo, and Mayor Moore. Councilor Howard was opposed and Councilor Moreside abstained. Motion carried.

On a motion by Councilor Howard and a second by Councilor Mingo, it was unanimously voted to approve a Liquor License renewal for St. Croix Country Club.

It was moved by Councilor Moreside, seconded by Councilor Rogers, and unanimously voted to signed a Memorandum of Agreement with the MDOT for the purchase of the Former Tourist Information Center on Union Street.
